Response to CHPM Exploratory Note No. 1



Air Superiority

Claim: "India achieved clear air superiority by 10 May."

Air superiority exists only when one side can operate freely in the air without prohibitive losses.

Reality:

IAF lost Air Superiority in first 30 minutes of combat after losing 7 Aircrafts:

4 Rafales, 1 Mig-29, 1 Mirage-2000, 1 Su-30

India Requested the U.S. for a Ceasefire

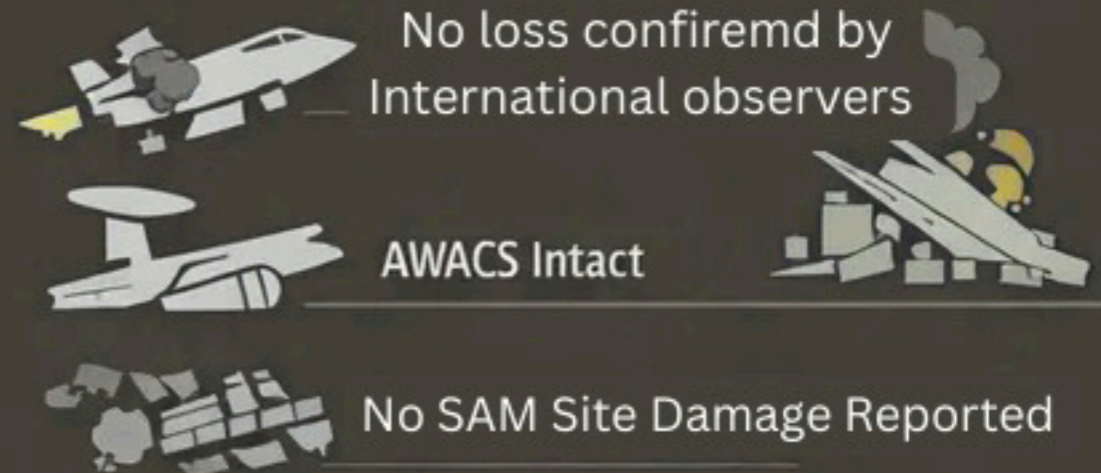

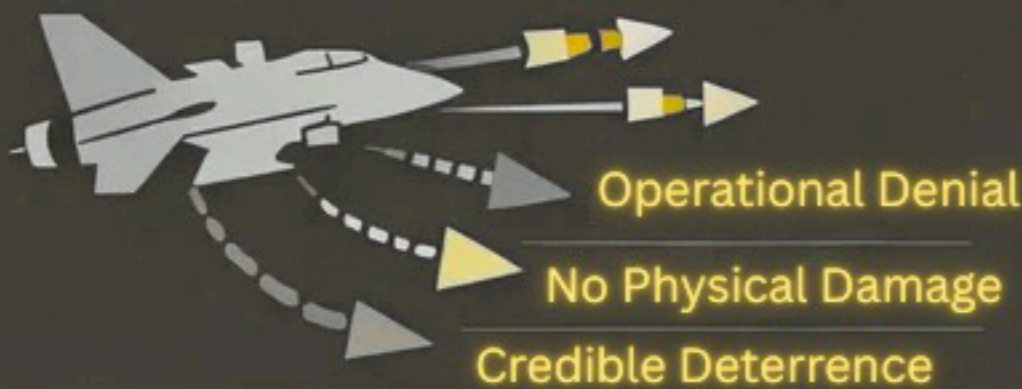
Claimed Damage

Lack of Airspace Access = No Physical Damage



Air superiority is measured by presence and persistence, not post-conflict claims.

Pakistan gained and maintained Air Superiority, imposed costs, preserved Escalation Control, and maintained Credible Deterrence

Contrary to the report's claims, Pakistan retained full air capability — Indian 'Air Superiority' never materialized.
